Therefore, Peter's only foundation when he stated the plan of Salvation (Acts 2:38) has to be in The Name of YAHWAH (YHWH). If he stated any other name, than either he was a false prophet or all the prophets in the Old Testament (Old Blood Covenant) were false. But why believe either of them when there is to be a true plan of Salvation to be embraced that was given by YAHWAH (YHWH) to both Peter and all the prophets.

I will end with the REAL Acts 2:38: "Then Peter said unto them: Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of YAHWAH HaMashiach for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." May YAHWAH (YHWH) the God (Elohim) of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob be with you all and lead you into this truth that sets us free from the world's tradition!

# The Name of יהוה (YHWH - YAHWAH)

It is a proven fact that everywhere you see "The LORD," "GOD," and the mis-transliteration of "Jehovah" in the King James Version Bible, and in most of all other translations, is where the Name of God: YAHWAH (YHWH) was taken out and replaced approximately 6,828 times. We must identify who the One True God of Israel is in the Old Testament (Old Blood Covenant) to be able to move into the New Testament (New Blood Covenant). "The LORD," and "GOD" are not names, to begin with, they are titles. If I were to sign a check as one of my titles such as "Father" then the check would be invalid since it does not have my name on it. These titles replaced The Name (HaShem): YAHWAH (YHWH) that was originally written in the Old Testament (Old Blood Covenant) Scriptures.

There are several reasons why we use the name of YAHWAH (YHWH) in the Old Testament instead of the name Jehovah/Yehovah. The reason being that the name of Jehovah is fairly new and it was a mistransliteration, invented by a Catholic monk by the name of Petrus Galatinus in the 16<sup>th</sup> century.

# A Look At The Name of Jesus (Iesus / Iesous)

Now we will move on to perhaps the biggest error in the Bibles...the name of Jesus (Greek-Latin name "lesus" and Greek name "lesous"). First, we want to say that we worship the same Messiah (Mashiach which is called

Christ in Christianity) that died for us 2,000 years ago on the stake of Calvary. However, we do not use the same name to refer to the Messiah (haMashiach) as Christians do. It is very easy to find out that the name of Jesus could have never been the Name of the Messiah (haMashiach) since it is less than 300 years old and it was not found even once in the 1611 KJV Bible. It is a Greek-Latin-English (Hybrid) name which was first introduced in the 1769 KJV bible. The only reason it is English is because of the letter "J" which was introduced in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century to distinguish the consonant from vowel "I". In 1611 KJV bibles, it uses the name "Iesus" which is a Greek-Latin name ... but that is not all: The name "Iesus" was actually transliterated from "Iesous" which is a purely Greek name.

Many try to trace back the name of Jesus to a Hebrew name "Yahushua/Yehoshua" or Aramaic name "Yeshua" which means "YHWH saves" and says that's the true name of the Messiah (haMashiach) - the name above every name, which is impossible. Also, another amazing fact is that when you open the front cover of most KJV Bibles, it's written that the bibles has been revised, which simply means changed, from its original.

Considering those facts: It is clear that the name "Jesus" could never have been the name of the Messiah (haMashiach) since it's less than 300 years old and cannot be found in the 1611 KJV bible. However, if you are still not completely convinced, please consider this: There are thousands of people in today's world named Jesus. Why would the Messiah (haMashiach) be given a common name? Phil. 2:9 said He has "a name which is above every name;" and Hebrews 1:4 said: "Being made so much better than the angels, as he hath by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they." So, what is that Name above every name?

### What is the Name of the Son (Humanity of God)?

Let us consider the scriptures and see what the Son has to say about what His Name was. The scriptures written in Philippians 2:9 that "Therefore God also has highly exalted Him, and given Him a Name which is above every name." That means the Son was not given a common name that many people have. He was given a Name that is above all earthly names. What is the Name above all names? Let's read John 5:43: "I am come in My Father's name, and ye receive Me not; if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive." The Messiah (haMashiach) makes it clear that He came in the Name of His Father. What is the Father's name? YAHWAH (YHWH). Therefore, the Name of the Son is YAHWAH (YHWH). It's very important to have this understanding: God did not have a Son, God was the Son (YAHWAH HaMashiach) - the Humanity of God (EI).

#### The Original Plan of Salvation

The real Acts 2:38 does not use a 300-year-old name of Jesus. The message the apostle Peter preached at Pentecost in Acts 2 was 2000 years ago. So that most certainly eliminates the name of Jesus. In Acts 2:16 it stated that Peter quoted from the prophet Joel in his preaching that day. We need to know what name that Joel and all the prophets used. It is easy to find out that the Name of YAHWAH (YHWH) was taken out of our KJV Bibles 6,828 times in the Old Testament. We now must realize that the New Testament wasn't even written until many years after Pentecost. The only scripture that existed at the time The Mashiach walked the Earth and at Pentecost was ONLY the Old Testament. The foundation of the New Testament is the Old Testament. The only way the message that Peter gave at Pentecost could stand, was for it to be based upon the foundation (The Old Testament). Any other message would crumble because it would have been a message that was not based upon The Word given by YAHWAH (YHWH) to the prophets (The Old Testament/Tanakh). If Peter truly quoted from Joel (Acts 2:16) which he actually did, for his message to have any authority, and now that we have found out that the Name of YAHWAH (YHWH) was taken out from the Old Testament 6,828 times, than we must conclude that Peter used the Name of YAHWAH (YHWH) at Pentecost when giving the plan of Salvation. That was not the first time the plan of salvation was given using the Name of YAHWAH (YHWH). It clearly written in Joel 2:32 (Rom.10:13, Acts 2:21) that whoever will call on the Name of YAHWAH (YHWH) shall be delivered (saved).
